Principal's Report

Dana Lee

- SREB Review last week; Southern Regional Educational Board District contracted with a company, at the district level, to give feedback on where school can improve. Last year they worked with middle schools; interviewed parents and students. Focus on CTE (College and Career Preparedness), spoke with CTE teachers, as well as LCHS students referred to as "completers" the push is to shore up all CTE programs in the district.
 - Issues: Master scheduling is a problem. The schedule is designed by the student's needs and desires, then the choice of electives is selected. Staffing for the courses students are interested in has been difficult (Example: Culinary Arts - LCHS has a kitchen but no qualified instructor). SREB came in to give feedback. More students attend CEC classes here at La Cueva than other high schools.
 - Conducted a survey about future plans for students; 1300 and some completed the survey; 12% plan to enter the workforce immediately, 7% enter some type of apprenticeship, 6% want to attend trade school, 12% 2-year college, 80% want to attend 4 year college, 20% no idea.
 - SREB's Report will come back in 4 weeks; the SREB team was overwhelmed with what they saw on campus, and their conversations with students. Students here are happy and know where to go for adult support and resources.
 - Demographic data from 2018 was provided; graduation rate is still improving after COVID, LC is still in the 93% percentile.
 - Demographics and social graphics have changed drastically but we have done well as a school at adjusting.
 - Principle Dana was commended on her presentation by the SREB.
 - District will come up with a plan on better access to CTE programs for school.
- Homecoming was a success.
- LCHS is 1 of 4 schools that is participating in a pilot program for "Gun Violence Prevention", which is coordinated through APS Police, APD, BCSO, Department of Justice, where they are speaking to 9th graders, in a short assembly format, during an advisory schedule. First assembly is in October.
 - La Cueva, West Mesa plus two other middle schools are pilot participants. The goal is to talk to students about the dangers of guns. Lots of social media threats and we have students on safety plans for checks. Students are doing the best to avoid guns at parties, etc. LC students have plans on what to do when they see guns at places and are more likely to leave parties to avoid it. If the

pilot goes well and is successful, it will be utilized throughout the district.

- "See something, say something Program" here at La Cueva we do have processes in place but the reporting and specifics are not always there.
- ALICE Fence Update: The funding is an issue; later around the holiday's; front won't be blocked off like previously stated. Still a plan in progress.
- Security Guards did not get granted. 4 more CSA available but no one has been hired through APS. At risk money to teachers who are doing perimeter security during lunch.
- Increase in alcohol in school reported from last year; purchased 2 new breathalyzers. Kids are not happy being randomly tested but are compliant.
- Public Comment would be helpful on school safety and comment.
